


CIVILIAN LABOR FORCE, 2000

The 2000 annual average civilian labor force estimates for Miami County were: total labor force - 50,500, employment - 48,800, unemployment - 1,700, and unemployment rate - 3.4. Miami County ranked seventy-first in unemployment among Ohio's 88 counties.

In 2000 the total employment for all industries in Miami County was 44,777, with the Manufacturing industry claiming the largest portion--34.0 percent. Average weekly earnings for all industrial groups in Miami County were \$549.52.


Miami County is located in the west-central portion of the state. U.S. Route 36 and State Routes 41, 55, 185, 571, and 718 cross the county east and west, and Interstate Highway 75, and State Routes 48, 201, 202, 589, and 721 run north and south. The Great Miami River and the Stillwater River flow through Miami County.

Attractions in Miami County include Piqua Historical Area State Memorial; Fort Rowdy Museum at Covington; Union Township Historical Museum and Quaker Research Center at West Milton; Pleasant Hill Civil War Monument; Benjamin Overfield Tavern; Brukner Nature Center; Tippecanoe Historical Museum; Hoover Grist Mill; Pickawillany Monument; Charleston Falls Preserve; Stillwater Prairie Reserve; Eldean Covered Bridge; Miami-Erie Canal Locks; and the Scenic Stillwater River.






